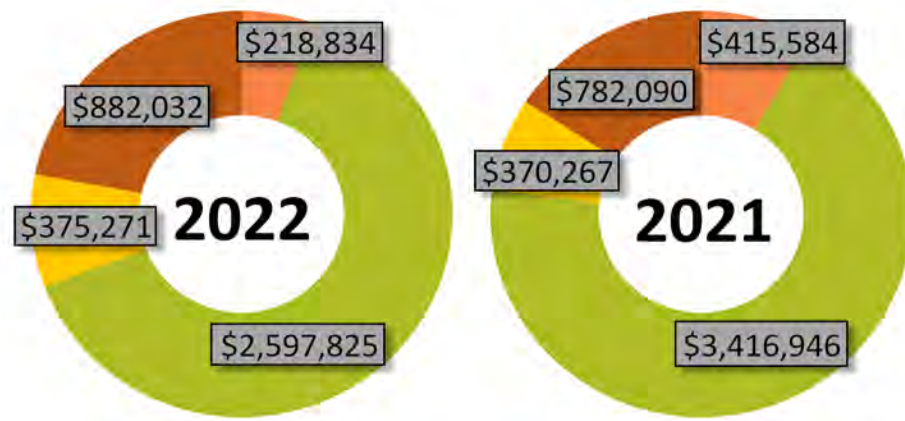


## Revenue Sources

**Program Services** consist of nutrition support, in-home health care, adult day health care and other senior-focused offerings. **Federal/State Grants** decreased post-pandemic. However, in 2022, NCCOA received \$1.3m for Fernandina Beach Senior Life Center Safety Renovations. **County/City Support** continues with funding from the Nassau County Board of Commissioners and City of Fernandina Beach. **Donations** increased by 12% in 2022, with support from individuals, companies and organizations totaling \$882,032.

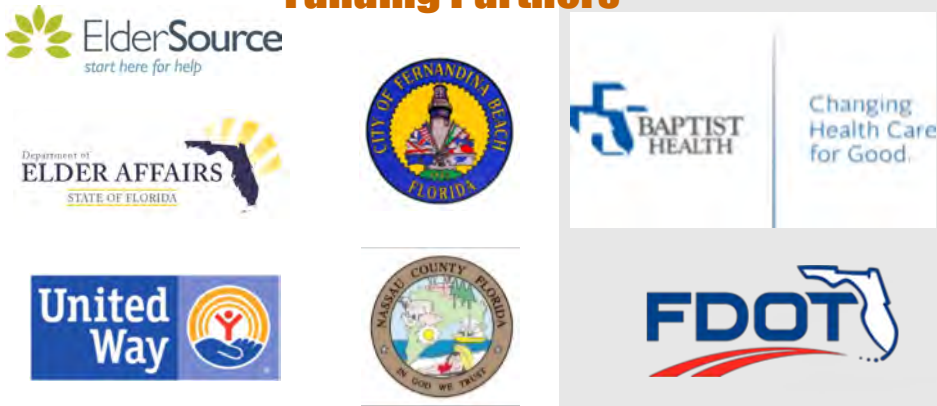
With your continued support our mission remains steadfast and our momentum is unstoppable as we move closer to **our 50th year of serving Nassau County seniors.**

## Nutrition

Meals on Wheels and congregate meals provided more than 45,000 meals to seniors, including the homebound. (Meals on Wheels for Pets also delivers food to dogs and cats.)



## Advocate Home Healthcare

Our in-home program matched Certified Nursing Assistants and home health aides with homebound seniors, assisting them with 22,000 hours of personal care, companionship, shopping and caregiver respite.

## NassauTRANSIT

Our fleet of 23 vehicles, providing the only public transportation in Nassau County, made 52,000+ trips in 2022 — a 41% increase. Local residents ride our buses to doctors' appointments, shopping, school/work and more.

## The Club

Providing loved ones with physical or cognitive deficits through therapeutic activities, the program features caregiver respite, education and support. In 2022, numerous hands-on activities and countless hours of respite supported Club members and caregivers alike.

## CHORE Small Home Repair

Our CHORE program allows seniors to remain independent, allowing them to “age in place” in their homes. Volunteers built ramps, installed grab bars and rails, and made other small home repairs, for a total of 278 projects.



## Senior Life Centers

In both Fernandina Beach and Hilliard, our Senior Life Centers offered close to 1,000 activities geared toward lifelong learning, including arts & crafts, cards & games, technology, fitness & dance, history & culture, language, finance, music, photography, government & wellness.

## Volunteer Program

Close to 300 volunteers supported NCCOA programs and services, providing 10,274 hours for an in-kind value of more than \$308,000.
